Ways To Help Your Child With Reading At Home

Please Do:

- Listen Quietly
- Stay OUT of the Book
- Enjoy the Story
- Enjoy the Rendition
- Tell (no frills)

Please Do Not:

- Say "Sound it Out"
- Cover the Pictures
- Talk, Meddle in the Story
- Discourage Pointing
- Give Hints
- **Tolerate Frustration**

What to do when young readers get stuck:

- 1. Wait and see if they work it out.
- 2. Say, "Try it again."
- 3. Say, "Look at the picture."
- 4. Say, "Think about what would make sense."
- 5. Say, "Read the sentence again and start the tricky work.
- 6. Tell the word. Have the student re-read the sentence to make it his own.

What to do when young readers make a mistake:

- 1. If the mistake makes sense, don't worry about it.
- 2. If the mistake doesn't make sense, wait to see if the reader will fix it.
- 3. Say, "Try it again."
- 4. Say, "Did that make sense?"
 5. Say, "Did what you read look right and sound right?"
- 6. Tell the correct response. Have the student re-read the sentence to make it her own.

Strategies For Your Child To Learn

What can you do when you don't know a word?

- Look at the picture.
- Go back to the beginning of the sentence.
- Read again.
- Say the first sound of the tricky word.
- If you get stuck again:
- Go back to the beginning of the sentence.
- Read again.
- When you get to the tricky word, say the first sound, then use a chunk you know.
- Think what would fit there.
- Now give it a try:
- Does it make sense?
- Does it sound right?
- Does it look right?
